InTouch Credit Union does not have the be-all, end-all solution for any of those scenarios, either, but we do have a good place to start in the form of our Financial Awareness webpage (www.itcu.org/financial-awareness). Available to access wherever and whenever is most convenient for

your schedule, the Financial Awareness page is a resource for money-related educational exercises.

There's the It's a Money Thing® with InTouch Credit Union video playlist where visitors can watch three-minute animated video overviews on topics as wide-ranging as "using credit," "financial investing," "protecting and insuring," and more. More than 40 videos are available to watch, and the lessons can apply to anyone regardless of age or experience.

Members can also enroll in the complimentary training modules offered by the Knowledge of Financial Education (KOFE) group on this same page. Each KOFE module focuses on a specific financial subject, like maintaining a budget, and allows the user to test their understanding while also tracking their progress.
